# FIC Vision & Mission

- Vision: Make New York State an innovative leader in sustainable textiles and fashion by leveraging our worldclass agriculture, manufacturing, and design for a resilient economy.
- Mission: Connect researchers, farmers, designers, and manufacturers to accelerate innovative solutions using natural fibers and next-generation biomaterials to catalyze the New York State circular supply chain.



# Pilot Grant Program

- Up to \$10K per grantee for a 12-month period – up to 12 grants expected per annum
- Grantees:
- Receive mentorship through relevant consortium member locations
- Become part of a cohort that receives business-related services and resources, especially for early-stage entities
- Are encouraged to use grant funding to engage FIC and other industry experts and rent time on FIC equipment (at reduced rates).





# Types of Projects

- The FIC will make grant awards that stimulate innovation in four areas:
- Agricultural Production and Processing
- New Materials and Manufacturing
- Manufacturing and Textile Technology Innovation, Improvement and Expansion
- Fashion Use of Sustainable Materials.

## **Possible Projects include, but are not limited to:**

- New fashion or home décor products made with NY-raised wool, hemp, or flax.
- Addressing related supply chain (farm-to-fashion) and manufacturing issues.
- The development of NY-grown or -made feedstocks for biomanufactured textile fibers.

# Who's eligible?

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NY State-based start-ups, small businesses, farmers, university-based researchers starting businesses, sole proprietors, and individuals

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Military veterans, women minorities, and socially or economically disadvantaged entities are encouraged to participate.

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Collaborative proposals are welcomed, but \$10K is maximum award.
