### **The Office of Global Learning**

- Primarily takes care of documentation concerns, including, but not limited to, I-20s, visas, CPT/OPT approval
- Students can visit office hours and make appointments with Immigration Officers
- Hosts PREPARE, a pre-first year summer program for students to learn more about campus and integrate with the international student community before they enter classes
