CASPHA is geared toward the College of Arts and Sciences, addressing issues such as credit requirements, distribution requirements specific to the college, and being pre-health with a non-science major. However, all students are welcome to join.

Participants will learn about cutting-edge surgical technology, including how to perform sutures, biopsies, and other medical operations. They will also hear from guest lecturers in the medical and surgical fields and connect with fellow pre-health peers.

#### **Service-Oriented Organizations**

- CU EMS (cuems.cornell.edu/)
  - Cornell University Emergency Medical Service (CUEMS) is a student-operated, New York State registered, first-response emergency medical services agency that serves the Ithaca Campus of Cornell University and surrounding University-owned properties and roadways, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week during the academic year.

  - Cornell Red Cross hosts blood drives and service events in the Ithaca area, as well as a variety of professional and social events throughout the semester.
