

Fiber Etch on Fabrics

- This technique is more commonly known as DEVORE
- □ The technique works best on fabrics blends: cellulose + non cellulose
- The chemical 'attacks' on cellulosic (plant based) fibre, leaving the other fibre within the fabric intact.




Types of Fabrics

- Silk viscose velvet
- Silk viscose satin
- Polyester cotton azeta (Poly-cotton)
- Polyester cotton jersey (Poly-Cotton)

Directions:

- Screen Print pattern on the back of the fabrics for velvet and satin, polycotton can be done on either sides
- Dry thoroughly with hair dryer
- Iron till turns brownish-burnt
- Wash in warm water
- Dye the fabric

Fiber Etch on Watercolour Paper

Directions

- Paint a watercolor wash on the paper and dry completely.
- Apply Fiber Etch® and allow to air dry.
- Using translucent tracing/baking paper between iron and watercolor paper, iron on medium heat until etched area becomes very dark brown-black.
- Rinse under running water and brush away darkened bits with a medium bristle brush revealing white core interior of paper.



Fiber Etch on Wood

To achieve a woodburning effect

Directions:

Apply Fiber Etch®, dry thoroughly.

Heat activate with a heat tool until the color is as desired
