

Did you know?

- There are two types of medical schools: allopathic (MD programs) and osteopathic (DO programs). Though distinct in their philosophical approaches to medical care, both prepare fully licensed physicians.
- You don't have to decide your specialty area before applying to medical school. In fact, exploring your interests in medical school is encouraged.
- Medical education typically takes 7-12 years to complete, starting with 4 years of medical school education
 after earning a bachelor's degree, and then 3-8 years of training in a specialty area. The average yearly cost
 of tuition, fees, and health insurance for medical school ranges from \$39,149-\$64,765 (2020-2021).

Medical School Application Preparation

- Completing the prerequisite courses is just one aspect of the process. Applicants must also have a well-rounded application consisting of experience (shadowing, volunteer work, undergraduate research, life experience, etc.), letters of recommendation, MCAT scores, and a strong admissions essay.
- Medical schools look for students who chose meaningful experiences that they are able to reflect upon during the application process.
- Applying to medical school is a year-long process. Students applying in their final year at UO will have a gap
 year before starting medical school. Students can work, take courses, travel, etc. during the year. Keep in
 mind, the average age of a first-year medical student is 24.
- Some medical schools (including OHSU) are moving to a <u>competency-based</u> admission model, recommending, but not requiring, specific pre-requisite courses. Successful applicants demonstrate skills, knowledge, and abilities through reflection of coursework, background, and experiences.
- Be sure to research individual programs about any COVID-19 related changes (Pre-recs and MCAT exceptions, clinical experiences, Pass/Fail Policy, etc).
