It's not too late to file your 2021 taxes and see if you qualify for important tax credits!



The Earned Income Tax Credit has expanded criteria for 2021 that may benefit you and your family!

- There is **no** age cap for 2021;
- You are *not* required to have dependent children;
- Childless workers from age 19 to 24 (who are not half-time or full-time students) and claimed as dependents on their parents' tax return *are* eligible
- Qualifying children must be biological or adopted children, grandchildren, younger siblings, and nieces and nephews who live with you at least half of the year and be under age 19, be under 24 and a full time student, or be permanently disabled

The increased eligibility of EITC has been shown to

- Reduce income inequalityⁱⁱ
- Decrease activity limitationsⁱⁱⁱ
- Lower rates of mild and severe disease diagnosis ⁱⁱⁱ
- Increase work hours and access to employer sponsored health insurance
- Lower BMI ⁱⁱⁱ

Receiving the EITC has also been linked to improved health outcomes such as:

- Improved self-reported mother's mental health^{iv}
- Improved employment for unmarried mothers
 vi
- Mothers of 2+ children have seen improved overall, physical, and mental health^v
- Improved mental health for married mothers vi
- Decreased BMI ⁱⁱⁱ
- Increased food expenditures ^v
- reduced psychological distress^{vi}
