Every day millions of calories are burned at treadmills and stationary bicycles across America. Where do these calories go? They are dissipated as heat and contribute to our climate crisis. Gym energy is always expended but never recycled. We see the space of the exercise class as a potential site for collaboration. World-wide and local research into the bicycle as a means of creating electrical energy led Friends of Ficus to produce performances that transform gym energy into art energy. Nearly every gym in the Bay Area hosts spinning classes, which use bicycles, music, and narrative visualization to generate sweat, heat, cardiovascular activity and fitness.

If each of these spinning classes were connected to autonomous electrical projects, imagine the kilowatts of power we could return to the community. CathexiSpin will provide mobile spinning classes open to the public as part of 01SJ. Our spinning bikes are custom-built and designed, each with its own electrical generator. Classes will be scheduled at regular times during the festival. Each class will be led by an artist-spinning instructor. The pedal power created by the collaborative effort of the instructor and participants produces an aggregate reserve of electrical art energy. When there are no scheduled classes, the bikes will be available to visitors who wish to independently contribute to our bank of art energy.
