For instance, in my Bird CLEF Sounds project, I developed a machine learning model that accurately identifies Eastern African bird species by sound, resulting in 90% accuracy.
2. Data Analytics: I have proficiency in data analytics tools such as Pandas, NumPy, Selenium, and BeautifulSoup. In my Chicago Cyclist Bike Share Analysis project, I developed a predictive model that accurately forecasted annual membership signups, resulting in a 20% increase in membership acquisition.
3. Database Tools: I have experience working with database tools like MySQL, MongoDB, UML, and Entity Frameworks. In my Lennox International project, I handled internal software and alert messaging API, ensuring 99.9% uptime and a 15% decrease in support requests.

Top 3 Strengths:
