## *Composting*



- ▷ Composting is the natural process of recycling organic matter
  - ▶ Turns into material that aids plant growth / soil amendment
- ▷ Composting is effective for handling waste
  - ▶ Provides many benefits

  - ▶ Browns, greens, water

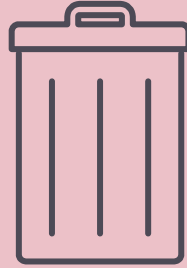
*So then... what's recycling?*
