Important Vocabulary



Gender Discrimination \rightarrow

Unequal or unfair treatment based on someone's gender

Example: saying that boys are better at math than girls are

Making decisions based on gender that result in favoring one gender over the other

Example: only boys can take math classes because they are better at math than girls

← Gender Bias

Gender Wage Gap \rightarrow

The difference between what women are paid for working to what men are paid for working

Example: In 2023, women on average are paid 16% less than men are paid for working the same jobs

Gender Equality: Targets and Indicators



5.1

End all forms of discrimination against women and girls everywhere.



5.4

Recognize and value unpaid domestic work through providing more support in public services and policies, and promoting shared responsibility within the household and the family.



5.2

Eliminate all forms of violence against all women and girls.

Proportion of women and girls facing sexual violence

5.3

Eliminate all harmful practices, such as child, early and forced marriage.

Proportion of girls married before 18; Proportion of women and girls who have faced harmful practices **5.5**

Ensure women's full and effective inclusion in leadership positions in political, economic, and public life.

Proportion of seats held by women in governments; Proportion of women in managerial positions

5.6

Ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights.

Number of countries with laws that guarantee sexual and reproductive health care and education.

United Nations Report on Progress Towards Goals

The world is **NOT** on track to achieve gender equality by 2030.

It will take:

286 years to legally protect women and remove discriminatory laws

140 years to achieve equal representation in leadership in the workplace

47 years to achieve equal representation in governments

In 2022, many countries did not have laws that prohibited discrimination, the pay gap, or child marriage.





5.5

2023: National parliaments - 26.5%. Local parliaments - 35.4%. Has been increasing.


Sub Topic 1: Women in Management

Problem

- Women account for 40% of total employment.
- Of the 40%, only 28.2% women held management positions.
- Women's representation in management is still at a low across all regions.

Current/Possible actions

- Address pay inequalities across the board.
- Provide flexibility
- Provide equal opportunities for growth and development





Sub Topic 2: Legal Protection of Women's Land

Problem:

- Many men and women involved in agricultural production lack ownership of their land.
- The share of men owning land is twice as many as women.
- 60% of the 71 reporting countries in this trial stated they had little to no protections for women's land rights.

Current/Possible Actions:

- 51% of the 41 countries with laws recognizing customary land tenure explicitly protect women's lands rights.
- Provide mandatory quotas to ensure women's representation in land management.




