 - An introduction e-mail will be sent to students informing you of your advisor assignment by major and alphabetical split
 - Students will have the opportunity to meet with their advisor over the summer to review the Fall 2024 schedule and review long-term program plan

Summer 2024

- Bouvé Advising will review your Global Scholar Courses/Summer Coursework
 - Students will have the opportunity to do a Final Review schedule at mandatory summer orientation.
 - Students will meet with their advisor to solidify their co-op schedule, minors, etc.

College of Engineering Global and London Scholars: Transition to Boston

- **Summer Planning Advising Meetings: 2/5 – 3/1**
- **Summer Planning Webinar: 2/6**
- **Curriculum Planning Webinar: 3/21**
 - Students will learn how to identify an appropriate schedule of fall classes using the undergraduate catalog and their degree audit and will create a draft of their 4 or 5-year plan using the COE planner templates. Students should complete a plan draft prior to meeting with their Engineering Advisor in May.
- **[COE Undergraduate Academic Advising Sharepoint site:](#)** Review information about course registration, long term curriculum planning, and download the Excel planner tool for your engineering major.
- **Fall Course Registration: begins the week of 4/8-4/12**
 - Students will register themselves for their fall classes. Time tickets indicate when you'll be able to register for classes and will be viewable on Thursday, April 4th via the Course Reg portal in the Student Hub (instructions on following slides).
- **Meet Your Engineering Advisor: 5/6-5/31**
 - Students will be invited to schedule a virtual meeting with their Engineering academic advisor. Prior to the meeting, students will be required to create a draft of their curriculum plan, which they will review together along with the fall schedule of classes, making adjustments when necessary.

College of Arts Media and Design (CAMD)

Academic Advising

Fall 2024 Registration Meeting: CAMD Assistant Director of Advising **Shayna Selinger** will be reaching out to all Global and London Scholars to encourage them to make individual appointments with her to review Fall 2024 registration at the end of March. During this meeting, students will review pertinent registration information and discuss what advising will look like for them starting in the summer.

Students will be pre-registered for Fall 2024 courses by the advising team based on degree requirements and conversations during the 2024 registration meeting, and any accrued transfer credit previously earned, but it is important that students feel empowered to adjust their schedule.

Pre-Orientation Meeting: Students will hear from CAMD to schedule a pre-orientation appointment with their assigned academic advisor in late May to early June. In this outreach, they will also be prompted to utilize our orientation canvas page. This meeting will allow the student to re-review Fall 2024 registration and discuss short-term planning and best practices on how to work with CAMD Advisors.

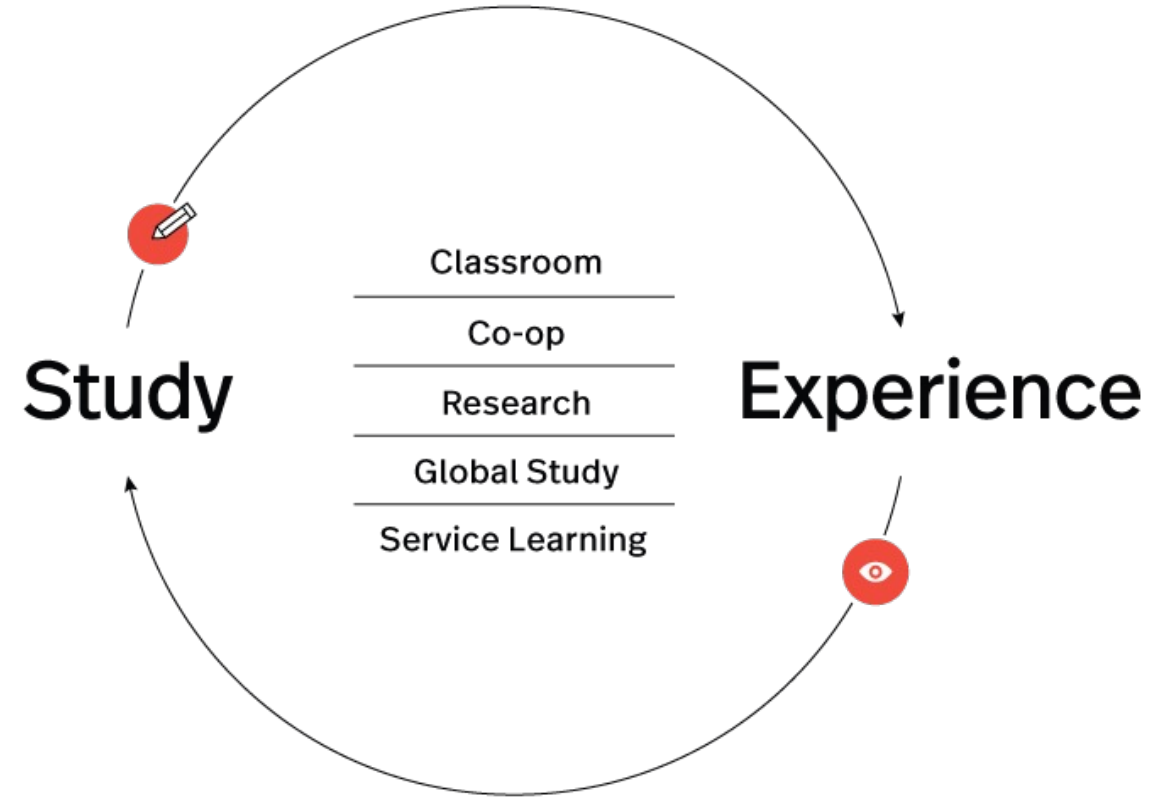

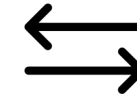

Fall Transition Considerations

As you are nearing the end of the Spring Term, OGS wanted to prepare you for the next steps to adjust your nonimmigrant status within the U.S.

An I-20 must be created to reflect your transition from your current program to the studies in the fall to continue into your Bachelor's Degree program.

Global Scholars: Change of Degree Level I-20 Request Required: [Linked here](#)

London Scholars: Pre-Arrival I-20 Request Required: [Linked here](#)

Please note that this does not pertain to Permanent Residents or students studying on another study-eligible nonimmigrant visa that doesn't require full-time studies to maintain your status.

If you have not reported your study-eligible nonimmigrant status to OGS, please do so to appropriately update your record through the Data Form, [linked here](#).

Preparation for the I-20 Request

- **What documents are needed for the I-20 Request?**
 - Unexpired Passport Copy
 - Passport must have an expiration date of 6 months into the future from new term start
 - Financial Documentation covering the next academic year of study
 - Funds must be liquid in nature
 - Document must be issued within 1 year of new term start date
 - Funding does not need to be frozen or have a maturity date in the future
 - Currency Converter must be included if funding is not in U.S. Dollars
 - Financial Requirements Reminder: [Linked here](#)
- **How much funding must be shown on the financial documentation?**
 - Funding must meet one academic year (2 semesters) of required study
 - Tuition and Fees: \$65,440
 - Living Expenses: \$26,920
 - Total: \$92,360
 - Estimated of Expenses for I-20 Requests: [Linked here](#)

I-20 Processing Expectations

- Timelines for action will depend on your final term in the Global Scholars and London Scholars Program
 - **Global Scholars:** I-20 processing will begin after completion of your final term (Spring, Summer 1, Summer 2/Summer Full)
 - **London Scholars:** I-20 processing will begin in April to allow for appropriate visa application timelines

Post I-20 Issuance Considerations

■ International Travel

- Global Scholars with a valid F-1 visa and I-20 with valid travel signature
 - Be sure to review your F-1 visa's "Entries" and "Expiration Date" for awareness.
- London Scholars with a valid F-1 visa and I-20 would be able to enter the U.S. up to 30 days from the new term start date.

■ Immigration Clearance

- After your I-20 has been issued, you will receive instructions through e-mail on how to activate your F-1 status closer to the start of your new academic term.
- The Immigration Clearance process will activate your degree program information to your F-1 status.

- This upcoming I-20 is estimated to cover you for the remainder of your Bachelor's Program.

 - Future changes to your plan (Travel Signature, Internship/Co-op, Leaves of Absence, Study Abroad)

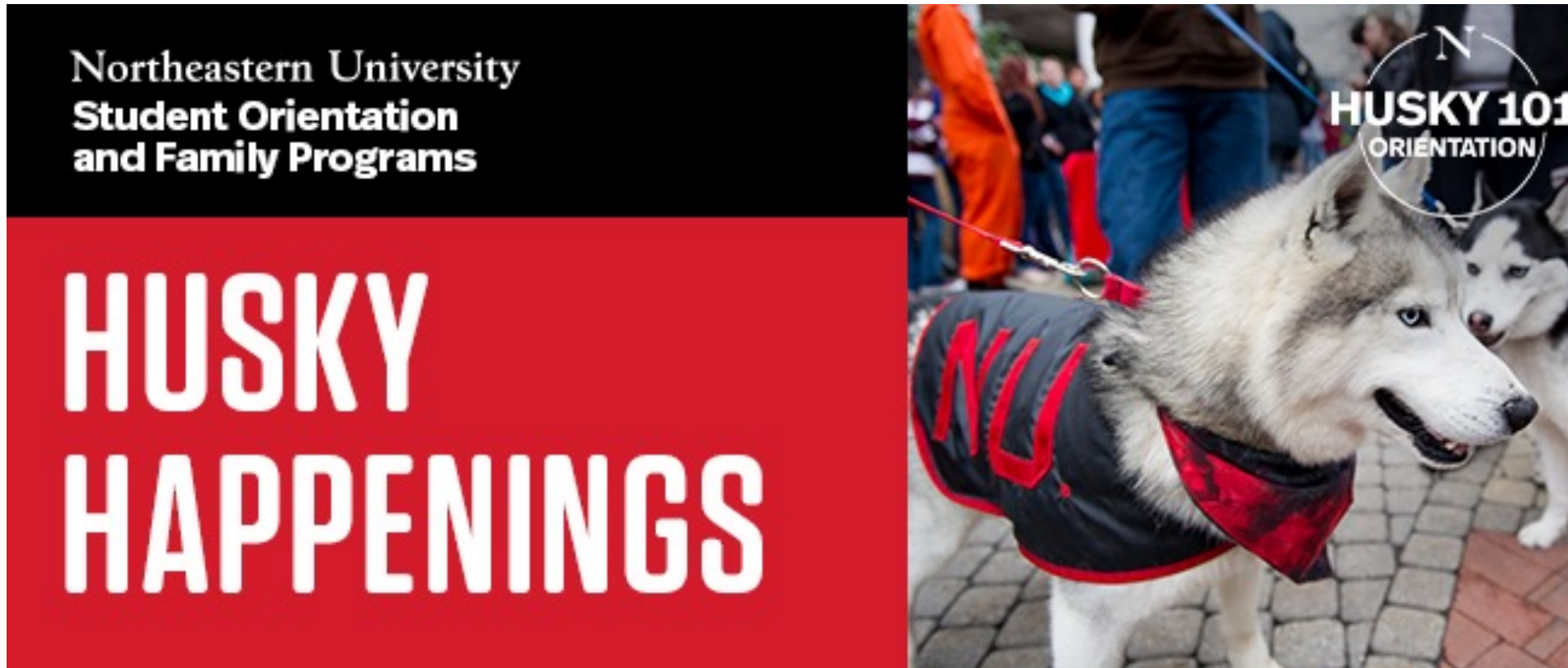
