## *GO Train*

The GO Train is a great way to get into downtown Toronto from many different areas in the GTA. All GO Train lines connect to Union Station in downtown Toronto, which is a 25 minute walk from our campus.

From Union Station, connections to the TTC Subway trains are available.

## *Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)*

The TTC is the main public transport available in Toronto. The underground subway trains connect downtown Toronto to the surrounding areas, including Etobicoke, Scarborough, and North York. Additionally, the TTC also employs a fleet of streetcars and busses to serve more of the city.

When using the TTC Subway trains, the closest station to our campus is Osgoode Station. From here, it is a 10 minute walk along to campus.

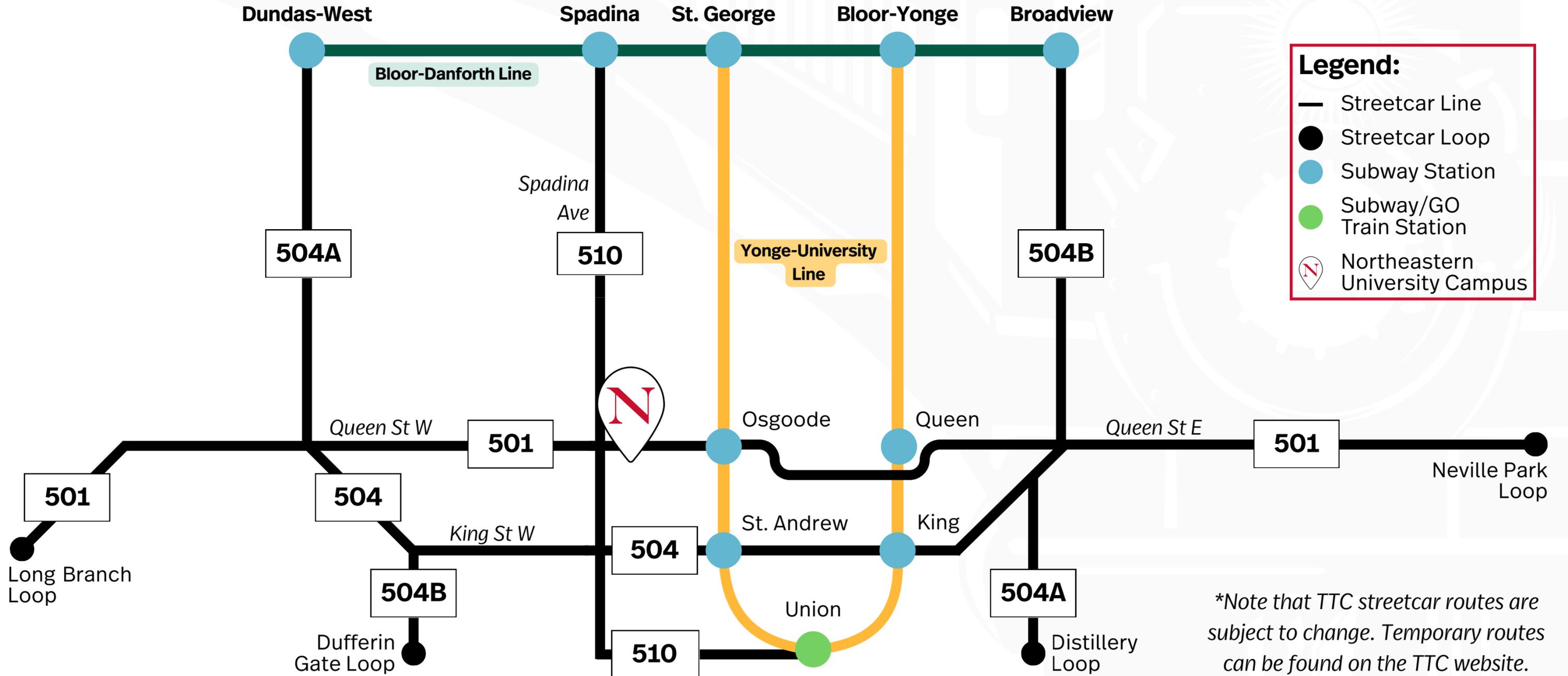

## Campus Operational FAQ



### Husky Card

- Campus Identification
- Entry Access to Campus
- For Campus Check In
- Access to print/scan

### How do I access the building?

With Husky Card:

- Gain access into the building by tapping the card on a panel adjacent to the door.
- Check into campus by tapping your card at the terminal on the front desk.

Without Husky Card:

- Alert NU staff of your presence, who are positioned on inside of the campus entrance.
- NU staff will open the door for you and manually check you in.
  - Make sure you know your NUID as it will help expedite the check in process.

*\*Note it is prohibited to access the campus before the check in process is complete*

### What happens if I lose my Husky Card?

- You will still have entry to campus, as security will always give access to the building and manually check you in.
  - However, a replacement is recommended for seamless campus access, event check-in, and applying for student discounts.

*The fee for a replacement card is \$25 CAD, which would be added to your tuition*

## Campus Operational FAQ

### Where can I find my class schedule?

- Your class schedule can be found on your Student Hub.
- *Student Hub > Classes > Select 'Term' > Select 'Course' to view details*

### How do I read my class schedule?

- **Classes are listed as the building followed by the classroom number**
  - The 1<sup>st</sup> digit within the classroom number represents the floor number, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> digits represents the room number on the floor.
    - E.g. QSW 513 = 5<sup>th</sup> floor, room number 13

### Can I bring Friends and Family to the campus?

- Yes! Friends and family are welcome.
- Please be aware that the space is not child-friendly. All guests must promote the idea of campus safety and well-being, and in consideration of the learning environment for other students.
- Guests must stay with students at all times and they cannot join classes. Check in with NU staff first.

### Where can I meet with Student Services Departments?

- On the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor all departments will be available if you have any questions or concerns.
- Please check the [Student Life Site](#) to find information on drop in Sessions and contact information of advisors.

## Campus Operational FAQ

### When can I access the campus?

- Campus is Accessible Monday-Saturday
- Monday-Thursday accessibility hours are: 8:30 am-9:00 pm
- Friday-Saturday accessibility hours are: 8:30 am- 6:00 pm

### Where can I eat on Campus?

- In all common areas, food and drink can be consumed.
- Beverages can be consumed in Huddle and Phone Rooms.
- Eating food in classrooms is prohibited.
- A student kitchen will be available on the Lower Level upon completion. Until then, students may use the 3rd floor kitchen.

### Where can I store my belongings on campus?

- Secured lockers are available on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> floor this Fall, with additional lockers becoming available once the Lower level is complete.

*Items left overnight will be considered abandoned*

### How to Book spaces on Campus?

- Northeastern room booking software is called Robin - log in with your Northeastern credentials [here](#). You can reserve spaces up to 10 hours in advance.

### What are the Available Spaces?

- Huddle rooms for individual or group work (up to 2 hours, bookable)
- Multifaith and wellness rooms for a multifunction private space (up to 30 minutes, bookable).
  - Please see the Front desk for available prayer mats.
- Phone rooms for private calls and work (up to 30 minutes, first-come first-served).
