About MYC

The Mayor's Youth Council is a program for high school students facilitating participation in civic engagement

- Housed within the Office of Youth Engagement and Advancement (OYEA)
- **Students collaborate** with city officials, community organizations, and like-minded young people
- 86 high school participants/members in 2022-23 school year

Each member/student is both in one Committee and one Neighborhood Working Group (NWG)

- **Eight Committees** based on existing City of Boston departments + Youth Lead the Change
- **Six NWGs** comprising neighborhoods with roughly equal populations

Work Environment

100% in person; small office; new team/department (OYEA); very young team (19–25-year-olds)

- Team inhabited brand new office space learned to advocate for needs and resources as team solidified and gained more insight into its role for MYC
- Office lacked kitchen space and appliances and had a less than constant water supply (this caused **dissatisfaction**)
- **Learned** firsthand **about the slowness of a bureaucracy** when issues arose for the team
- Such as access to water and onboarding times for payroll
- Combination of independent and teamwork
- Asked colleagues questions whenever needed
- Clarified work responsibilities, processes, software, etc.
- Learned through experience
- Navigated new software, systems, tasks, and hierarchies to complete tasks
- Check ins with teams had **two weekly meetings**
- Co-op team
- Entire OYEA staff (6-8 people)

My Role – Neighborhood Working Group Specialist

- Connect youth to city government and community organizations
- Facilitate Committee and NWG meetings
 - o **Ensure meetings progress** according to time allotted
 - Provide insight on how best to move forward with project without taking executive control
- Oversee everything to do with Neighborhood Working Groups
 - Order food for NWG meetings
 - Keep track of meeting attendance
 - Delegate and take on tasks assigned to co-ops based on each person's workload
- Assist in developing, managing, and conducting outreach and engagement initiatives for MYC recruitment and events
- Attend all MYC events and initiatives
- Assist head coordinator with day-to-day operations

Unique Opportunities

Completed MYC program outreach in neighborhoods

- Biked in different neighborhoods of Boston and promoted MYC application, and various Committee and NWG events through fliers and word of mouth
- Gained deeper awareness of Boston's diverse community and businesses while potentially attracting more youth who could contribute to and benefit from MYC
- **Made valuable connections** with individuals especially interested in the program
- Completed 25 hours of "in neighborhood outreach"



Experiential Liberal Arts

My co-op encompassed all three components of the Experiential Liberal Arts.

Research

 Various MYC projects required me to complete research within archives, webpages, etc.

Education

- I facilitated a program allowing youth to engage in **experiential** learning through civic engagement;
- I learned the intricacies of managing a civic engagement program for youth in a city government undergoing major changes

Outreach

- I **promoted MYC** in small businesses throughout Boston;
- I expanded potential student applicant pool;
- I exposed more youth in Boston to the program

Special Projects

Worked on 4 successful NWG and 7 Committee projects

- NWG 5: **Wake Up the Earth MYC** staffed promoting table at Wake Up the Earth festival in Jamaica Plain
- Presided over group's planning meetings
- Tracked group event expenses
- Communicated **event regulations**; updated emails to group
- Offered feedback on Wake Up the Earth Google survey used to gauge attendees' opinions on neighborhood quality, gentrification, cleanliness, etc.
- Aided with set up and staffing of tabling event
- NWG 2: Dot Fest mental health-focused game event at DotHouse Health's Generation Next Academy Teen Center
 - Facilitated planning meetings
 - **Supervised communication** to Dorchester Liaison, Ross Cochran
 - Supported communication to DotHouse Health Teen Center Director, Dirk Bovell
 - **Completed outreach** for event in Dorchester; distributed fliers; interacted with constituents with "word of mouth"
 - Helped NWG 2 staff event at teen center aid with setup and activities

Personal Reflection and Future Plans

I learned that

- I work well in a collaborative environment, especially when it comes to distributing tasks evenly with other co-ops
- I am not afraid to ask for help
- I need to get better at suggesting new projects or collaborations for myself when I have less to do
- Repetitive tasks can cause me to lose focus/drive, but I get myself back on track by reminding myself of benefit to MYC youth
- I found that variety in day-to-day work and activity was a good way to remain motivated and engaged
