Pollutants from land



- *Toxoplasma gondii* a parasite that causes neurological problems in California sea otters
 - <u>Source:</u> released in felid (cat) feces and enters the ocean in runoff water
 - Conclusions: Wild cats are involved in infecting sea otters, BUT domestic cats are also known to carry it



Still unsolved: How does the parasite get from the water into the sea otter?







- **Domoic acid** a toxin that causes brain damage and seizures in California sea lions
 - <u>Source</u>: Released by harmful algal blooms (HABs) in rivers or the ocean
 - Conclusions: nutrients are often from agricultural fertilizers, BUT also from natural sources


(left) A healthy sized hippocampus of a sea lion




(right) shrunken hippocampus of a sea lion brain as a result of domoic acid toxicity (Marine Mammal Center)
