

Job Description: BSC Research Fellow

BSC empowers public organizations to find context appropriate solutions and improve the implementation of their policies and programs. BSC supports government implementation teams around the world to solve complex public problems, offers a variety of executive training programs, provides tools and self-paced guides, publishes papers, posts blogs, records podcasts, and hosts events on a wide range of topics in international development. BSC has trained over 4,500 practitioners in 156 countries and created a community of practice on implementing public policies.

- Support the execution of BSC's action research projects, including executive education programs
- Work in close collaboration with project stakeholders in the field and travel to project sites as needed
- Build and maintain networks and strong relationships with colleagues, counterparts, and the community of practice
- Conduct other miscellaneous tasks related to the ongoing activities

- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Exercise good judgment in problem solving and decision-making
- Passion for supporting policy practitioners to improve their outcomes
