dollars 🌣

Always lowercase. Use figures and the \$\mathscr{S}\$ sign in all except casual references or amounts without a figure: The book cost \$\mathscr{S}4\$. Dad, please give me a dollar. Dollars are flowing overseas. For specified amounts, the word takes a singular verb: He said \$500,000 is what they want.

For amounts of more than \$1 million, use up to two decimal places. Do not link the numerals and the word by a hyphen: *He is worth \$4.35 million. He proposed a \$300 billion budget.*

The form for amounts less than \$1 million: \$4, \$25, \$500, \$1,000, \$650,000.
