Always lowercase. Use figures and the $\$$ sign in all except casual references or amounts without a figure: The book cost \$4. Dad, please give me a dollar. Dollars are flowing overseas. For specified amounts, the word takes a singular verb: He said $\$ 500,000$ is what they want.

For amounts of more than $\$ 1$ million, use up to two decimal places. Do not link the numerals and the word by a hyphen: He is worth $\$ 4.35$ million. He proposed a $\$ 300$ billion budget.

The form for amounts less than $\$ 1$ million: $\$ 4, \$ 25, \$ 500$, \$1,000, \$650,000.
