

The deadline is March 30 for fall proposals and September 30 for spring.






OLLI Program Activity Levels are designed with our members in mind. Below is a description of the activity levels that we use for our Out & About Series or other programs that may require physical activity.*

- Members must be able to climb a few stairs.
- In addition to Level 1, members must be able to stand up for an hour and get on and off a 15 passenger van / motor coach.
- In addition to Levels 1 & 2, members must be able to climb a few flights of stairs and walk over uneven surfaces.
- In addition to Levels 1 3, members must be in good health, mobile and able to participate in 3 to 5 hours of physical activity per day and walk up to 3 miles over uneven ground.
- In addition to Levels 1 4, members must be in excellent health, extremely mobile and have an active lifestyle.

Some activities may require completion of a waiver of liability.



PLACE, PROPERTY, AND FAITH: A STORY OF THE AGENCY **AND RESILIENCE OF FOUR GENERATIONS OF BLACK** ARKANSAN WOMEN

DESCRIPTION: This class combines oral history and archival sources to trace the historical and contemporary intersections of systemic racism and Black placemaking. Black placemaking emphasizes endurance, persistence, agency, belonging, and resistance in the face of institutional limitations, restrictions, and surveillance of Black life.

Using the transgenerational family journey of four generations of Dr. Valandra's maternal ancestors, the course illustrates the intergenerational transmission of family recovery, restoration, resistance, and resilience within the context of chattel slavery, civil war, reconstruction, and Jim Crow South and North. Some of the salient themes covered in the course include individual and collective identity, freedom seeking, migration, emigration, family bonds, patterns of child rearing and socialization, spirituality, enterprise and land acquisition, and Arkansas' back to Africa movement. The genealogical process guiding the project and some resources will also be shared with participants.

THE ORIGINS OF THE ENGLISH **ALPHABET**

Before the alphabet, writing systems were immensely complex, often consisting of hundreds upon hundreds of pictures or signs which could represent anything from a syllable to a word. This meant that only people with many years of intense education could read or write. When the Phoenicians began to circulate their invention around the Mediterranean, the world was changed forever. Suddenly, each symbol, or letter, stood for a single sound. This meant that words could be sounded out much more easily, opening the door for access to reading and writing for many more people.

Joshua Jacobs, a Classics student at the U of A, will trace the history of writing, from Mesopotamian cuneiform to the Hebrew abjad, the Greek alphabet, and finally, our own.

WHO CAN YOU TRUST WITH YOUR LAND?

A conservation easement is a voluntary agreement that permanently protects the conservation values of lands that are privately owned. This course will highlight how the NWA Land Trust works with landowners to protect critical ecosystems, working lands and scenic views for future generations. We will also discuss other tools that the NWA Land Trust uses to protect land, such as long-term leases and fee-simple donations.

In 2019, the City began construction on large solar power arrays at the city's two wastewater treatment plants. The two plants are the city's largest consumers of electricity making up approximately 67% of electricity consumption. The solar arrays generate approximately 18.3 million kWh/vr of clean electricity saving the City over a half a million dollars last year. Peter Nierengarten, Fayetteville Environmental Director, has been promoting energy efficiency, renewable energy and sustainability since 2012.


