Yellow Brown Mordant as above boil gently 1 hour Dye bath  $2\frac{1}{2}$  gallons bark chop cover with water, soak overnight next day boil 2 hours strain add to make 2 gallons boil gently 30 minutes Rinse & dry OR no mordant add  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup alum to dye bath just before adding wet wool

R. abortivus Cherokee used juice as sedative tea for sore throat & thrush, poultice for boils

Fox root styptic in epistaxis

acris Bella Coola poulticed mashed roots onto boils Iroquois used leaves with poison ivy to thin blood Montagnais, Abenaki, & Algonquin inhaled crushed leaves for analgesia in headache

flabellaris Fox snuffed stigmas as sternutatory

repens Herquist chewed leaves & poulticed on aches, myalgia, rheumatism & sores women took 3 or 4 leaves after childbirth to heal the "insides"
