8 Algonquin poulticed burns Bella Coola used tea for tuberculosis Cherokee smoked leaves for catarrh, cold, sore throat & bronchitis tea for colds & poured it on hot rocks for steam inhalent for headache

Sioux powdered flowers as depurative Chippewa used flower decoction in steamer baths for rheumatism & paralysis with mint's Delaware used roots in tonic compound Mohawks drank flower infusion with mullein roots for asthma

Mohegan used leaf infusion for colds Ojibwa powdered flowers on coals to inhale for strokes!

Potawatomi smoked flowers to repel evil spirits & poulticed leaves into indolent ulcers

Cherokee dry leaves smoked for catarrh warm tea for cold smoke or chew leaves for colds for throat infection, leaves & stems smoked for bronchial cough dry leaves for chewing tobacco cold tea poured over hot rocks steam to cure headaches or sunblindness



Parts Used: Roots

Collect in fall emetic, cathartic, diaphoretic, expectorant & diuretic (for dropsy) fibrous bark used by Indians for cordage A. androsaemifolium Indians believed eating boiled root caused temporary sterility Green fruit boiled for heart & kidney treatment root tea to keep kidneys functioning properly during pregnancy powder dry root; burn on coals & inhale fumes for headache small dose of powdered root to induce vomiting increase perspiration Tonic & laxative A. cannabinum $\frac{1}{2}$ oz crushed root boil in pint water 1 or 2 oz doses several times a day as laxative powdered root induces vomiting entire plant steeped in water to treat intestinal worms, fever, dysentery, asthma, pneumonia, intestinal inflammation indigestion was considered heart stimulant

A. androsaemifolium dry powdered root powerful digitalis-like action Large doses emetic, poison; medium doses cardiac stimulant; mild doses alterative, tonic, cathartic 1 tsp root/pint boiling water 2-3 tbsps 6 times daily or 1 grain of powdered root (use caution) 3

A. androsaemifolium Boiled roots are oral contraceptive Cherokee used to treat mange in dogs Chippewa & Ojibwa used roots for headache snuff, inhaling, or poulticing incisions on temple Chippewa diluted tea for children colds decoction for earache root for convulsions dizziness, insanity, nervousness, palpitations & twitching Fox used root as diuretic for dropsy bark in compound for womb injuries, snakebite troquois fur-bloody flowers Potawatomi root or berry decoction as cardiac & diuretic for heart or kidneys Cherokee root for pox for dropsy uterine obstructions rheumatism asthma coughs whooping cough root tea for kidneys for cordage

Cherokee used roots for asthma, Brights disease cough, dropsy, pertussis, pox rheumatism uterine obstructions

Fox used root tea for ague, cold, dropsy, fever, headache sore throat etc. Ojibwa tea for pregnant kidneys

Cherokee tea of roots and berries is tonic diaphoretic, antiseptic, astringent, expectorant, for coughs, asthma, diseases of the lungs, for weak backs, fresh wounds and cuts, bathe burns in ooze of beaten roots, bind ooze of root on swelling tea for menstrual problems

3 fresh root bark emetic, cathartic as infusion Oil of seed in earache deafness 3

Easy to cultivate, requires little care. Propagation by root divisions or seed.
Thrives in various conditions prefers rich humus pH 5-6 partial shade moisture.
Heavy leaf winter cover left in place 14 dracontium pH 6-7 otherwise same 14.
12 Hardiness dig in summer transversely slice & dry (age) Stimulant, diaphoretic, expectorant & irritant.

As poultice to reduce swelling (works) 9 corms grated & boiled in milk to treat coughs & tuberculosis.

Cherokee plant or root for ague chest pains, colds, coughs dyspepsia fever headache pain pleurisy rheumatism rhinitis, snakebite, sore throat, syncope toothache typhus & vertigo Delandre decoction root (with wintergreen optional) as tonic Mohican poulticed root onto snakebite Lumbee root tea for Bright's disease, dysmenorrhea, prostatitis, renitis, snakebite Nanticoke ate root as vermifuge Natches used root decoction as febrifuge Penn's root anti-convulsant

Appalachian root mashed in milk to snake & spider bites, leaf tea for chills

Ch root decoction externally for swollen feet, legs chips of stalk in tea for yellow urine

Serpentaria Tonic for typhus fevers, ague & fever, diuretic antiseptic OVER

Cherokee (cont.) gargle for sore throat, stops mortification prevents bowel putrefaction
for weak phlegmatic habits, drink for sharp breast pains, wash for headache
for dizziness or fainting black-yellow diseases; drink tea or chew roots for colds,
drink cold infusion of plant to relieve pain and prevent fainting tea for rheumatism
