- 3 Indians poulticed leaves to tumors & swellings astringent hemostatic tea of leaves or bark for bleeding of stomach, injection of tea for inwardly bleeding piles ointment 4 part bark extract to 2 parts ointment for local application or extract on cotton to poultice, extract in wet bandages for varicose veins 3

H. petiolaris Hopi washed spider bites with infusion Navaho life medicine Thompson put leaves to sores <sup>or swellings</sup>

H. tuberosus Western Indians made tea of stalks & leaves & drank twice daily, ate flowers for rheumatism
