Menominee in compounds for leucorrhoea

4 americana Chippewa roots with sweet cicely for amenorrhea bruises, hepatitis & inflammation root decoction anticonvulsive Menominee antidiarrheal Mohawk runners sweetened with maple bark to improve wind Nanticoke chewed petals for chills or fever Seneca tonic Potawatomi root tea for vertigo

Ch for swollen breasts, in decoction for poor digestion tea for liver/laxative

## Parts Used - Root

combine with golden seal internally for bowel or bladder 2 pts. goldenseal to 1 pt. Alumroot (Kloss)  
well-drained humus pH 5-6 propagate by seeds, root division or rooted creepers moist, dense shade  
protect from slugs light winter cover left in place <sup>149</sup> root decoction used in 1800s for sore  
throat and by Indians as a poultice on skin lesions & wounds root infusion used  
to treat diarrhea and a leaf poultice for skin abrasions.

H. americana Cherokee root for diarrhea, dysmenorrhea, dysentery, hemorrhoids, bleeding chawed for  
flying glossitis, powdered on indolent ulcers Fox put leaves to sores Menominee root decoction for stomach pain  
ste root for upset stomach Meskwaki astringent in healing sores root for cancer (also hispida pubescens & villosa)

Ck root astringent tea for bowels immoderate mense flow piles, hemorrhages powdered root on <sup>malignant</sup> ulcers  
tea with honey for thrush & sore mouths dysentery, chew root to take coat off tongue, sprinkle tea  
on sunburn sores.

# *Humulus lupulus L.*

## Hops

King George III had a pillow filled with hops to induce sleep hot poultices applied to boils & inflammations Also used to treat fever, intestinal worms & rheumatism to increase urine flow & as a sedative

Tea to counter alcohol Cherokee used like aspirin for pain, to induce sleep, breast, displaced womb, gravel, inflamed bladder & kidney hysteria & rheumatism leaf tea for urinary Dakota roots analgesic vulnerary fruit decoction febrifuge Delaware put hot leaves to earache or gums for toothache flower tea tranquilizer drunk several times a day for nervousness, in hot foot baths for arthritis muscular swellings and rheumatism Dakotas & Omahas put roots to wounds as vulnerary Fox root sedative, for insomnia Mohegan flower tea for nervous tension

Navaho leaf tea for coughs & flu Ojibwa decoction antacid diuretic

Ch for gravel inflamed kidneys bladder alleviates pain produces sleep for rheumatism breasts & complaints fallen womb

# Hydrangea arborescens L.

## Seven Roots Wild Hydrangea

9 Indians decocted roots for dreamers during menstrual periods roots & rhizomes increase urine flow & is tonic & laxative colonists used to treat kidney stones 9

3 root or calish/fresh root for later infusions or decoctions infusion 1/2 root to cup of boiling water for gravelly deposits relieves pain of emulsion diuretic lithotrophic antilithic leaves Tonic, slightly cathartic 3

8 roots diuretic, heart, tonic Cherokee chewed bark for stomach, high blood pressure antiseptic stimulant bark bound onto burns, sores, sprains, swellings & tumors in tea for dysmenorrhea, nausea, bilious Delaware <sup>roots</sup> combined with Iris for gallstones

Cherokee Inner bark and leaves stimulant, antiseptic, antiemetic, good for ulcers, tumors, sprains, in tea for menstrual period purgative, bark infusion to induce vomiting to throw off disordered bile, cold tea of green inner bark to stop vomiting in children bind on scraped bark for burns and risings poultice for sore or swollen muscles chew bark for stomach trouble for high blood pressure

Prefers moist humus optimum pH 6-6.5 Beech-leaf winter cover desirable 14

Dr. C. S. Rafinesque Medicinal Flora 1829 Indians employed juice or infusion for external complaints, as a topical tonic. Some Indians also employ as diuretic stimulant & escharotic; use powder for blisters, infusion for dropsy. Internally bitter tonic for internal disorders (stomach, liver, etc.) Barton 1804 spirit infusion tonic bitters (W. Penn.) root infusion in cold water for Eye Wash for inflammation of eyes. U.S. Pharmacopoeia Digestive disorders, mucus membranes, 9 Appalachian root tea tonic & improves appetite watery root infusion used by Indians & pioneers for watering eyes. Powdered roots were applied to open cuts & wounds to form scabs (works KB) Cherokee mixed with bear grease & rubbed on skin as insect repellent Pioneers chewed roots for sore mouths Leaf infusion for liver & stomach ailments 9 Alternative tonic gastrointestinal & nasal catarrh & inflammation of mucus membrane of vaginal, uterus & urethra Powder infusion 1 tsp to pint for tonic or douche, ulcers wounds dyspepsia erysipelas, remittant, intermittent & typhoid fevers, torpor of liver, ophthalmia, mouth ulcers & spermatorhea. 3 8 powdered roots for catarrh, eyes, mouth ulcers, hemostat diuretic astringent tonic Cherokee mixed with bear grease for insect repellent, for cancer, debility, dyspepsia, gonorrhoea inflammation skin & appetites Ch Cancer, tonic, debility improve appetite dyspepsy both for local inflammations, dye

H. rotundifolia Roxb. Cooling slightly acrid pleasant taste. Clears fevers, detoxifies, hydrates resolves mucus  
for 1) colds & influenza, coughing & sore throat 2) boils, abscesses 3) jaundice & liver cirrhosis whole plant  
5 ch'ien-2 liang decoction

pH 5-6 dry open woods No special care <sup>14</sup> *H. sampsonii* Hance stops bleeding, knits bones, injures fetus, kills worms  
for (1) incomplete break of measles rash (2) bacterial dysentery, diarrhea (3) mastitis snakebites, infections, swelling (4) hematemesis, epistaxis,  
burns, cuts (5) menstrual irregularities, traumatic injuries, backache Whole plant 5 ch'ien - 1 liang decoction  *H. japonicum* Thunb.

Clears fever, detoxifies, reduces swelling & resolves bruises for (1) acute hepatitis, pain in  
liver, appendicitis (2) boils & abscesses, mastitis, snakebites whole plants 5 ch'ien - 1 liang  
decoction  *H. ascyron* L. cold bitter taste Clears fevers, detoxifies promotes pus drainage & tissue healing  
for 1) Boils & abscesses 2) stomachache, vomiting; headache; whole plant 3-5 ch'ien decoction 

3 *H. perforatum* Infusion 1 oz to 1 pint boiling water wineglassful astringent nervine & aromatic  
coughs colds lung diseases urinary disorders ointment for bruises scratches & insect bites 3  
3 *H. punctatum* astringent in diarrhea & dysentery 3

8 *H. hypericoides* St Andrews Cross Cherokee chewed root for snakebite sniffed for nosebleed  
tea for bowels, debility, fever, flux, & VD Choctaw root decoction for colic leaf decoction collutum  
Hawas root decoction for fever pain, birthing & toothache Lumbee for baby diarrhea bladder kidney skin  
*H. perforatum* Montagnais decocted leaves for coughs  Meskwaki; for snakebite & tuberculosis

9 *opaca* in the last century bark & fruits gathered fresh before frost chopped to pulp mixed with 2 parts by wt. alcohol bottled & stood 8 days for laxative worms coughs pleurisy constipation fever gout rheumatism & tumors decoction of root bark for colds coughs & tuberculosis 9 *vomitoria* Indians made infusion of leaves for laxative tonic & narcotic "soft drink" 9 *I. cornuta* Lindl.  
cooling bitter taste brings down deficient fevers strengthens back & knee for 1) recurring fever in pulmonary Tuberculosis, tubercular lymph nodes 2) joint pain, lumbago whole plant roots leaves & stem 4 ch'en-1 liang fruit 3 ch'en decoction 9 *I. asprella* Champ. cold bitter taste clears fever & detoxifies promotes salivation quenches thirst reduces swelling resolves clots (bruises) for 1) high fever in colds, angina, acute tonsillitis 2) traumatic injuries, boils & abscesses Roots 5 ch'en - 2 liang decoction 9 *I. verticillata* berries emetic bark astringent decoction for diarrhea, intermittent fevers, tonic 3

8 *opaca* Cherokee berries for colic & dyspepsia leaves scratched on cramped muscles Lumbree decocted tops for colds, flu, itch, pneumonia, thick berry syrup for childrens diarrhea thrash legs for dropsy with leafy root until fluid runs *verticillata* Iroquois bark antiseptic, astringent, tonic Ojibwa bark for diarrheas

Ch *opaca* berries for colics scratch cramped muscles with leaves chew berries for dyspepsia berries in dye wood for spoons carving Christmas trees

Fox poulticed fresh plant on sores Mohegan poulticed crushed buds for bruises, burns & cuts

Malechite for jaundice Nanticoke poulticed on burns Ojibwa rubbed fresh juice for headache

Omaha poulticed eczema & rash Potowatomi infused plants for bruises, chest colds, cramps, poison ivy rash, sores, sprains & burns

pallida Omaha poulticed leaves & stems on eczema or rash

Cherokee stems in decoction for easy delivery with yellow pine cones, speedwell root and red elm bark bathe privates in warm decoction to speed up delivery ingredient in green corn medicine rub crushed leaves on child's sour stomach leaf tea for measles, root tea for "bold hives" in babies, rub juice of seven blossoms on ivy poisoning

dropsy & gravel poulticed root on rheumatism diuretic, suppressed urine, laxative, expectrant,  
root tea for cholera morbis (bowels) soak sweet potatoes in tea before planting to repel  
bugs & voles

*I. cristata* Cherokee put root in fat or wax to cancerous ulcers drank tea for hepatitis & yellowish urine  
*I. versicolor* poultice on sores, cancers Chippewa roots for scrofulous sores swellings

Cree root cholagogue purgative Creek for Heart Delaware mixed with hydrangea root for gallstones, alone for rheumatism & scrofula Malecite ganglion infusion for sore throat Micmac root for wounds

Missouri put to bruises, earaches, sores & eyewash Meskwaki for burns, colds, sores & lungs

Mohawk put on burns Montagnai poulticed root for pain Ojibwa for heart & temetic

Potawatomi poulticed on inflammations Penobscot panacea Pappa-hannock too Seneca on bruises

Cherokee tea for liver root in decoction for yellow urine stew mashed root in hog lard sheep suet & beeswax to make salves for ulcers

Diuretic Tonic alterative antispasmodic, stimulating diaphoretic. Large doses emetic, smaller tonic, expectorant  
Large doses of root cause vomiting small doses expectorant gargle for sore throat treatment for rheumatism  
& muscle spasms, to increase urine flow to treat syphilis cramps ulcers & mild cases of scarlet fever

Parts Used: nuts, wood, root bark

1 sweet edible nuts sap boiled by Indians to syrup root bark is liver stimulant + 9 inner bark tea cathartic oil from fruit for tapeworm & fungus infections 9 3 Barton 1798 wrote the extract of the butternut-walnut - appears to me to be one of our most valuable native cathartics. It is well adapted to the treatment of dysentery, in which, however, it appears to be operative merely as a laxative A decoction of the inner (root) bark of the tree has been very advantageously used." Gather bark in fall, dry & powder tsp to a cup of boiling water, a mouthful at a time through the day 3

8 bark for heart oil from hull for tapeworm & fungus Fox, Iroquois, Malecite, Menominee, Ojibwa, Potawatomi heart, tonic Cherokee bark tea bowels, heart toothache Meskwaki boiled twig bark as cathartic Delaware pounded bark fine boiled to strong lye stops bleeding (even arterial) prevents swelling speeds healing

*Juglans (2) nigra L.*

Walnut

inner bark mild laxative hulls of nut for intestinal worms ulcers & syphilis juice for tapeworms  
as laxative & gargle for diphtheria leaf infusion used against bedbugs 9  
*J. regia L.* Supplements kidneys stimulates semen, moisturizes lungs & stops coughing, reduces inflammation  
& alleviates pain for 1) deficient & chill-based wheezing & coughing 2) constipation & hard feces 3)  
seminal emission, impotency 4) swelling & aches in back & legs 3 crushed hulls for ringworm  
Missouri research (Science Nov 17, 1961) on depressant quality of hulls to stun fish, juice of hull boiled  
with honey as an excellent gargle. Oil from ripe nuts good for colic possible cure for tapeworms  
& skin diseases 3

Root bark for heart leaf infusion astringent against bed bugs Algonquin chewed husks for colic  
Cherokee chewed bark for toothache bark tea for smallpox, sores, leaf tea for goiters  
Comanche leaves for ringworm Delaware decocted bark for heart or emetic, hull juice for  
ringworm ssp on inflammation leaves scattered around house to repel fleas  
Fox inner bark decoction for heart infused charred bark for snakebite  
Hurons decocted leaves for hypotensive infused nutshell for itch  
Rappahannock bark from north side of tree treat chills, root bark tea in dysentery

(2) jaundice (3) difficult urination (4) restlessness & insomnia whole plant 5 chien-1 liang decoction

8 *effusus* Cherokee tea to impart strength prevent lameness & eliminate spoiled saliva

Cherokee decoction to dislodge spoiled saliva, wash babies in tea for strength  
tea with plantain to prevent infant lameness, string to bind up dough in oak leaves  
for cooking bread

Eastern Cedar

9 Appalachia mixture of seeds leaves & twigs boiled & steam inhaled for bronchitis Indians used decoction of boiled fruit & leaves for coughs, a warm poultice of sprigs for rheumatism & boiled leaf tea for convalescence & weakness decoction stimulant, for late menstruation & to induce sweating Using oil for abortion has proved fatal boil mixture of bark & water for skin rash.

8 Leaves stimulant emmenagogue tenia fuge Rappahannock infused berries with wild ginger for asthma Cree leaves diuretic powdered roots for venereal warts & excrescences Dakota Omaha Pawnee & Ponca burned & inhaled smoke for head colds Comanche depurative Creek fumes for neck cramps Cherokee for colds, dysmenorrhea, itch, measles, rheumatism, skin, swellings & worms Cedar decoction or steam for delivery Chickasaw heated with elder in hot water, & put on headache Chiropaud decocted twigs for rheumatism Fox decocted leaves to strengthen convalescents Lumbee tea for whooping cough Meskwaki for catarrh, debility & sores Ojibwa bruised for headache Natchez for mumps, leg swellings; pain in back breast & shoulder Pawnee smoke for bad dreams, nervousness Rappahannock steeped berries with Asarum for short breath Western Indians berry tea for 3 days contraceptive Red Cloud (Teton Sioux) decocted leaves for Asiatic Cholera 1849-50

C h diaphoretic, tea for colds & obstructions measles berries boiled in milk for worms ointment for itch white swelling rheumatism.
