Capital Letters Workbook

Handwriting is the first formal method that students use to translate language into writing and share knowledge (Connelly et al., 2007). It is an essential skill that requires clear and organized instruction for mastery. Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction is an instructional handwriting initiative that is based both on research and theory and uniquely emphasizes the production of letter formation through the use of graphic behavior. These rules are based on the sequences and directions that are used to produce geometrical shapes which are then applied to forming letters. Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction uses graphic behavior to analyze letter formation and organize the progression of instruction to optimize and simplify learning. Letters with fewer strokes that are easier to master are taught first. As the workbook continues, more complex letter formations that require more stroke variations are taught. The Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction workbook offers simple and precise instructions for writing each letter and provides plenty of opportunities for practice.

The *Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction*, capital letters workbook, is intended as a starting point for letter instruction. Capital letters are easier to learn than their lowercase counterparts because of the consistency in their size (one) and similar starting points. In contrast, lowercase letters are more difficult to learn due to greater variability in size (three) and starting points.

Letter Perfect Handwriting Instruction Workbook Organization

The *Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction* workbook is organized for simplicity and based on the principles of graphic organization. Letter instruction follows the following sequence:

- Starting point letters these letters have only one stroke. The starting point is emphasized (e.g., C).
- 2. Fluid letters these letters have more than one stroke. The second stroke is drawn from the endpoint of the first line (e.g., 'L').
- 3. Fixed letters these letters also have multiple strokes. The second stroke is drawn from the starting point of the first line (e.g., 'N').
- 4. Flexible letters these letters have multiple strokes and a second starting point. The second stroke starts at a point in space (e.g., 'K').

Active Perfect Handwriting Instruction also borrows from motor learning theory and incorporates two types of practice conditions, blocked and random. Blocked practice occurs when one distinct motor skill is repeatedly practiced before progressing to another distinct motor skill (Guadagnoli & Lee, 2004). With the Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction workbook, students practice each new letter, separately and repeatedly to mimic blocked practice conditions. Random practice occurs when multiple motor skills are practiced in no specific order (Guadagnoli & Lee, 2004). The Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction workbook provides random practice after each letter group is taught and at timely intervals within the larger groups (fixed and flexible) for opportunities to write the letters out of sequence and from memory.

With each letter, *Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction* highlights the starting point with a star and then provides numbered directional arrows that correspond with the line segments to guide the student's next strokes. These cues are gradually faded as the student gains competency through practice.

Each new letter also has a second page for students to continue practicing as well as a picture of an animal that begins with the practice letter. This second page demonstrates the practice letter used in a word and has an educational fun fact about the animal for further discussion. Coloring the picture provides students another fun opportunity to practice the fine motor skills used for writing. Practice pages are provided throughout the workbook to allow students to practice writing letters from memory.

How to Use this Workbook

The *Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction* was developed to provide simple instruction for children. Each new letter page opens with a sample of the capital and lowercase letter. Instructors should begin with modeling each new letter with a demonstration that emphasizes the letter's starting point, stroke direction, and stroke sequence. This can be done simply on a whiteboard or blackboard at the front of the classroom or sitting next to the student with a piece of paper or dry erase board.

Instructors should read aloud during the initial demonstrations and repeat before each new practice opportunity. Hearing the instructions and seeing the sample letters while writing the letters, gives students multi-sensory cues that improves learning. Instructors should monitor the students to ensure that they are drawing the letter segments from the correct starting point, in the correct direction, and in the correct sequence. The workbook provides multiple and varied practice opportunities to guide

students and promote good writing habits. Finally, students should be encouraged to reflect on their work and circle their best efforts.

Recommendations

- Give students plenty of opportunities to write, draw, and color with pencils, markers, and crayons.
- 2. Provide lined paper when students need to write.
- 3. Incorporate opportunities to discuss the practice letters throughout the day.
- 4. Always support the students' efforts and provide positive feedback.
- 5. Don't overemphasize neatness or speed. Emphasize proper letter formation.
- 6. Allow the students to critique their own work.
- 7. Have fun with writing!


Chapter One: Starting Point Letters

Young children develop certain tendencies when they begin drawing geometrical shapes (Meulenbroek et al., 1996). *Letter-Perfect Handwriting Instruction* applies these drawing tendencies to handwriting instruction. Chapter One of the workbook focuses on the starting point of letters that have only one stroke. Research suggests that children are inclined to begin copying the first segment stroke (the first line or curve) at the top and progress the stroke downward (Meulenbroek et al., 1996). Letters that follow this profile are O, C, U, and S.

Instructors should read the instructions aloud for each practice trial and take note that students are beginning each letter at the correct starting point. Students are encouraged to practice writing each letter separately (blocked practice) and then practice the letters together (random practice). The last page in this chapter is a lined blank page. This page is provided for the instructor to randomly dictate the letters O, C, U, and S for the student to practice writing letters from memory.




Chapter Two builds on the knowledge already learned with the starting point rule but slightly increases the difficulty by adding letters with a second stroke. With fluid letters, the second stroke fluidly follows the first stroke and continues where the first stroke ends. These letters include L, V, W, and Z.

Instructors should read aloud the instructions for each practice trial and note that students are beginning each letter at the correct starting point and continuing the next strokes fluidly and in the correct direction. Students are encouraged to practice writing each letter separately (blocked practice) and then practice the letters together (random practice). The last page in this chapter is a lined blank page. This page is provided for the instructor to randomly dictate the letters O, C, U, S, L, V, W, and Z for the student to practice writing letters from memory.

Chapter Three Fixed Letters

Chapter Three: Fixed Letters


The focus in Chapter Three is on the fixed letters. The task difficulty for these letters is slightly increased because the second stroke starts back at the starting position of the first stroke. Therefore, students are required to lift the pencil from the paper and restart to continue the letter. Letters that follow the fixed principle include A, B, D, E, F, M, N, P, and R.

Because this grouping of letters is larger than the letters in the first two chapters, it is broken into smaller practice sections. These groupings are based on letter formation similarities. Students will first practice fixed letters that have a curved second stroke (D, P, B, and R) and then practice the fixed letters that have a straight line for the second stroke (N, M, E, F, and A).

Instructors should read the instructions aloud for each practice trial and note that students are beginning each letter at the correct starting point, picking up the pencil to start the second stroke at the original starting point, and drawing subsequent strokes in the correct direction. Students are encouraged to practice writing each of these letters separately (blocked practice) and then practice the letters together (random practice). This chapter has two lined blank page to practice; one at the end of each letter grouping. These pages are provided for the instructor to randomly dictate the letters learned thus far (first O, C, U, S, L, V, W, Z, D, P, B, and R, and then O, C, U, S, L, V, W, Z, D, P, B, R, N, M, F, and A) for the student to practice writing letters from memory.

Chapter Four: Flexible Letters

Chapter Four introduces the letters that follow the flexible principle. These letters have the greatest task difficulty because the second stroke starts away from the first stroke. Students not only need to lift the pencil up to start the second stroke, but they must also judge the placement of the second stroke in relation to the first. Letters that follow the flexible principle include G, H, I, J, K, Q, T, X, Y.


The flexible letter grouping is further divided for smaller practice sections. These groupings are based on letter formation similarities. The first grouping contains flexible letters where the second stroke perpendicularly crosses the starting point of the first stroke (T, I, and J); the second grouping contains flexible letters that start with a curve (G and Q); and the third grouping contains the flexible letters that have a second starting point that is parallel with the original starting point (H, X, Y, and K).

Instructors should read the instructions aloud for each practice trial and note that students are beginning each letter at the correct starting point, using the correct second starting point and drawing the strokes in the correct direction. Students are encouraged to practice writing each of these letters separately (blocked practice) and then practice the letters together (random practice). This chapter has multiple lined blank page to practice between each letter grouping. These pages are provided for the instructor to randomly dictate the letters learned thus far (first O, C, U, S, L, V, W, Z, D, P, B, R, N, M, F, A, T, I, and J; then O, C, U, S, L, V, W, Z, D, P, B, R, N, M, F, A, T, I, J, G, and Q; and finally the entire alphabet) for the student to practice writing letters from memory.
